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ANTI-RAGGING CELL

VISION

Create a harmonious environment for mutually respected living.

MISSION

Create a Ragging free zone by creating awareness about the ills of ragging among the students within the campus.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To promote awareness regarding the Anti -ragging Act and severity of the punishment.
- 2. To absolutely prohibit ragging within the campus through frequent raids.
- 3. To make students accountable towards Anti-ragging through an explicit undertaking.
- To provide a mechanism to encourage students to report, redress and punish(if found guilty) any ragging activities.
- 5. To resolve the issues pertaining to abuse, ragging, annoyance, menace etc.

Policy:

The legal definition of ragging is as follows:

'Ragging' means the doing of any act which causes, or is likely to cause any physical, psychological or physiological harm of apprehension or shame or embarrassment to a student, and includes

- (a) Teasing or abusing by playing Practical jokes on, or causing burt to any student.
- (b) Asking any student to do any act, or perform any thing, which he/she would not, in the ordinary course, be willing to do or perform.

Ragging is different from other crimes because the motive is solely to get perverse pleasure.

Ragging is also different from other crimes as it is actively promoted by certain sections of the society.

Following types of abuses and activities will be termed as ragging:





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- Verbal abuse, for example swear words and phrases, direct or indirect derogatory
 references to the person's appearance, attire, religion, easte, family or chosen field of
 study.
- Forced activity, for example
 - Chores for seniors e.g. copying notes, cleaning rooms, etc.
 - Missing classes. Not being allowed to study.
 - Staying awake late or getting up at unreasonable times.
 - Singing or dancing or performing in any other way.
 - Using foul language or shouting or cheering loudly.
 - Misbehaving with strangers, particularly women.
 - Reading or browsing porno-graphic/objectionable material
- · Lifestyle restrictions, for example
 - Not allowing certain kinds of clothing or accessories e.g. jeans, belts etc.
 - Enforcing rules regarding shaving or oiling hair. Forcing certain kinds of dress.
 - Restricting access to parts of the hostel e.g. common room.
 - Requiring certain modes of address i.e. seniors should be called Sir or Ma'am.
 - Requiring a particular wake-up time.
- Conversational mind-games. Particular forms of interaction in which a senior or set
 of seniors manipulates the conversation so as to humiliate the first year student or make
 him/her feel stupid or insecure or generally threatened.

Note: This policy will be in effect from Academic year 2021-22.

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C) COMPLAINT AND REDRESSAL MECHANISM:

Any aggrieved who wants to file a sexual harassment complaint can do by either sending an email to Anti Sexual Harassment Cell or file written complaint with any member of the Cell. The complaint should include the specific nature of the incident, date and place of the incident, names of all parties involved as well as a detailed report of all pertinent facts. Complaints of harassment will be promptly and carefully investigated. Investigation will

include interviews with all relevant persons, including the accused and other potential witnesses.

Any student filing a genuine harassment complaint shall be protected from reprisal or retaliation as a result of filing the complaint. Investigators will make every effort to strike a balance between the parties' desires for privacy and the need to conduct a fair and effective investigation.

Harassment shall subject a student to disciplinary action up to and including expulsion from institute. However, if in fact it is determined through the course of the investigation that the incident and thus the accusation were fabricated, the complainant will face severe disciplinary action up to and including expulsion from the institute.

ZIMCA will make every reasonable effort to conduct all proceedings in a manner that will protect the confidentiality of all parties. Parties to the complaint should treat the matter under investigation with discretion and respect for the reputation of all parties involved.

The institute must constitute a committee that would be responsible to keenly observe that the above policies/ Rules are being strictly followed in the Institute.

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BUSINESS OF WAR

Across the world, it seems that wherever there is a war, there is the United States. In its 245-year history, the U.S. has only not becat war for 17 years. From the end of World War Two to 2001,

Americans were at the heart of 81 percent of the world's armed conflicts - 201 out of 248 in 153 regions of the world.

The mission always has a positive frame – from "maintaining justice" to "humanitarian intervention" – but the U.S. has launched or become mbroiled in wars at a very high cost. During the Korean War, more than 3 million civilians were killed and critical infrastructure will crushed. In the Vietnam War, two million civilians perished and at least 350,000 tonnes of bombs and landmines left a legacy of havoc. In the Kosovo War, the U.S.-dominated NATO bombed the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia for 78 straight days, leaving a trail of destruction. Mo recently, the 21st century wars in Afghanistan, Iraq and Syria mean that almost every U.S. president since World War Two has declared intervened overseas. However, while delivering humanitarian disasters to other countries, the United States has profited handsomely fro its adventures. U.S. News & World Report pointed out that for many years, wars and preparations for hostilities have been integral America's prosperity and affluence. Indeed, war is the business of America.

The Business of Oil

Oil has been central to many of the "interventions" in recent decades. The U.S. launched the Gulf War partly to wrest oil resources, seizi access to oil resources in Central Asia after going into Afghanistan, and used the Iraq War to consolidate its control over oil resources in the Middle East. U.S. strategic analysts estimated before the war that although the cost of the U.S.-Iraq war would be about \$177 billion, the value of Iraq's oil reserves was \$3.4 trillion.

The Business of Military Industry

Emerging during World War Two, the military-industrial complex gradually became a key pillar of U.S. hegemony. This concentrate economic and military power industry runs for war, feeding a large workforce and members of Congress along the way. Non-politic organizations such as so-called "think tanks" that specialize in lobbying for the interests of other industries – "political entrepreneurs" also rely on the system to survive, along with numerous research This has created a political biological chain: from the military-industri complex to voters, then the members of Congress, and political entrepreneurs. How has this chain been maintained over 75 years? TI United States has repeatedly chosen the old path of war. If there is war, it must have a stake. If there is no war, it must create one to mainta the military-industrial complex and feed the interests groups waiting for their lucrative scraps.

After World War Two, U.S. overseas wars and defense expenditures stimulated economic growth. During the Korean War, the procurement military supplies purchased by the U.S. government increased from \$20.7 billion in 1905 to \$65.1 billion in 1953. The tremendous military demand from the Vietnam War catalyzed the U.S. economic boom in the 1960s. A substantial portion of the weaponry used in the wars the broke out after the end of the Cold War came from the United States. To ensure the huge consumption of the Kosovo war, NATO significant increased the procurement of material, thereby stimulating the development of the industrialized military establishment. After the September 11 attacks, American economists published an article titled "Prosperity Will Rise Out of the Ashes" in The Wall Street Journa predicting that the future war on terrorism would bring prosperity back to the United States. Over the 20 years since the war in Afghanista began, the stocks of American military-industrial giants have soared. Do you really think that America's attempt to build an image as the "guardian of global peace" after two decades of war in Afghanistan means it cares about winning or losing? What it wants is to fight wars at keep on fighting for its own interests, whatever the consequences for others.

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
LOHAGAD FORT TREK (05/03/2022)

At the end each and every student had enjoyed a lot Each and every one were happy with the trek and with work of Adventure and Trekking Team as well as all were ready to come in next trek.


"Glo-W Talks" International Women's Day celebration on 11/03/2022

Alumni Meet 13/04/2022


ZIMCA organized Alumni Meet 2k22 on 23rd April 2022. More than 200 Alumni were present for program.

Blood Donation Campaign 21/6/2022


